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SUBJECT: Agreement #CP3246-01 FY2007 with Child Abuse Prevention Center.

BACKGROUND:

On September 15, 2006, the State Department of Social Services issued an All County Information (ACI) No.I-36-06, which awarded funds from the Child Welfare Services Outcome Improvement Project (CWSOIP) for Fiscal Year 2006/2007. The funds for FY 06/07 support activities that are necessary to improve outcomes for children and families consistent with the County Self-Assessment and/or System Improvement Plan (SIP).

Differential Response (DR) is a strategy which expands the ability of child welfare agencies to respond to reports of child abuse and neglect by diverting families to community resources at the first sign of trouble. Families receive help on a voluntary basis without being under the direct supervision of a county social service agency.

On September 28, 2006, a Request for Proposal was released and sent to 62 bidders and advertised on the internet. Five proposals were received ranging from an average of \$200 to \$2,000 per client. The lowest bid was deemed non-responsive leaving a responsive range of \$641 to \$2000. On November 16, 2006 the evaluation committee recommended awards to two (2) agencies. The John F. Kennedy Memorial Foundation and Child Abuse Prevention Center were found to be most responsive bidders, with the lowest responsive cost proposals with averaged costs per client of \$667 and \$641 respectively.

The John F. Kennedy Memorial Foundation was awarded \$100,000 to provide services in the desert region and Child Abuse Prevention Center was awarded \$300,000 for the remaining regions of the County.

The Child Abuse Prevention Center Agreement exceeds the Purchasing Agent's authority and is being submitted to your Honorable Board for signature.
