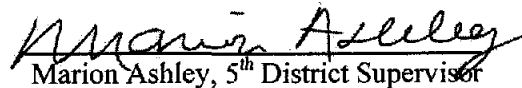

BACKGROUND: The annual Endangered Species Act Day event is hosted by the Riverside County Habitat Conservation Agency (RCHCA). The event brings about 250 local 6th grade students to Sycamore Canyon Wilderness Park to participate in an interactive program that illustrates the value and importance of conserving lands and preserving endangered species. Students take home the *Field Guide -Habitats, Plants, and Wildlife of Riverside County* to share with others and use as they explore the natural riches of Riverside County. The program is designed to make science fun and interesting while meeting the Sixth Grade Science Content Standards for California Public Schools. I urge the Board of Supervisors to approve this use of CFB-Community Improvement Designation funds.
