Summary (continued)

Exclusive Care currently processes and submits approximately 200 plan provider agreements and amendments each year to the Board of Supervisors. Due to the standardization of Exclusive Care plan provider agreements, County Counsel recommends waiving Board of Supervisors submittal and approval process. The Exclusive Care plan has established policies and procedures so that agreements and amendments can be handled effectively by Human Resources with consultation and approval by County Counsel.
